If you have circumstances which might affect your admission this may be discussed confidentially with a member of the admissions staff. The University operates on rolling admission, and application files are reviewed by an admissions counselor as soon as all requested credentials have been received.

IMPORTANT RANSFERIOTES

- x Webster has a minimum residency requirement that 30 of the student's last 36 credits must be taken at Webster University. All students must have a minimum of 128 credit hours to graduate.
- x Transfer students can apply up to 15 credit hours of approved coursework in the respective major from another institution. Students may transfer in-6 credit hours of approved feign language coursework to meet the International language requirement.
- x Within each major, a specified number of credits must be upperel.
 - Criminology majors must take a minimus 18 hours at the 300level, of which hoursmust be 4000 level.
 - Anthropology majors must take a minimum 24
